



TIPS FOR SUCCESS

GORILLA GLUE

- Always apply moisture – Gorilla Glue is a polyurethane adhesive, which means it needs moisture to start the curing process.
 - Gorilla Glue will foam three to four times its original size. A little goes a long way, so always use sparingly. Maybe even less than you think you need.
 - Always be careful of squeeze-out. Because the glue foams, only use a small amount. If you need to remove any uncured 'squeeze out' or wet glue, we recommend wiping with a dry cloth or using a standard paint thinner.
 - Make sure you use the solvent with care in a well-ventilated area. Always wear gloves. Once the glue is dry, it is best removed mechanically: try sanding, chiseling, scraping or picking at it. The glue will not damage tools.
 - While the glue dries, use clamps or apply heavy weights to set your pieces in place. If you don't have clamps, try a rubber band, tape, bungee clips or books! For best results, leave overnight for 24 hours. Avoid skin contact – always wear protective clothing and gloves when using Gorilla Glue.
 - Make sure surfaces are clean and tight fitting.
- For use on smooth, shiny surfaces, try sanding to roughen the surface, giving Gorilla Glue more area to bite into.
 - Gorilla Glue is thermoplastic. Which means there's little or no movement in the glue after it hardens.
 - If using Gorilla Glue for the first time, try a test piece before you start your project so you'll know just how to use it.
 - To prolong shelf life, squeeze the air out of the bottle and replace the lid tightly. Then store in a cool area, out of direct sunlight. Some people suggest storing the glue upside-down, which keeps the liquid glue near the lid.

GORILLA TAPE

- Make sure all surfaces are clean of dust and debris. For best results wipe surface and allow to dry before applying tape.
- Gorilla Tape adheres the best when applied near room temperature.
- To maximize the bond, press Gorilla Tape into the grooves and rough areas of the surface you are working with. This gets the adhesive into all the nooks for the best hold.
